## ***(Re-)Profiling the Translator and Translation Pedagogy***

### **3<sup>rd</sup> CTER Congress 2022**

**Kraków, 17<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> March, 2022**

**The Consortium for Translation Education Research** has been established to consolidate the experience and achievements of individuals, bodies and institutions that focus on translator education. Relying on local pedagogical traditions but reaching out for more experience and expertise beyond local contexts, it aims to elevate the academic status of Translation Studies in the area of Translation Pedagogy from a marginalized position to that of a fully professional and academically acknowledged field. CTER is open to a wide range of approaches – historical, linguistic, cultural, literary, epistemological, psychological, sociological, professional, practical and others, and its aim is to enquire into Translation Pedagogy as a modern sub-discipline of Translation Studies.

Two CTER Congresses have been organized so far. The 1<sup>st</sup> CTER Congress, held in 2016 and entitled *Inspirations for Translation Pedagogy*, focused on a broad spectrum of issues pertaining to the educational stakeholders, teaching content and methodologies involved in the process of translator education. The 2<sup>nd</sup> CTER Congress, took place in 2019 under the title *Complexity and Dispersion in Translation Pedagogy* and delved into the possible dimensions of complexity and dispersion in translator education. Both Congresses were endorsed by the European Society of Translation Studies (EST). The 3<sup>rd</sup> CTER Congress will aim to explore the ways in which Translation Pedagogy can respond to the dynamics of the translation profession and the incessantly (re)emerging translator profiles.

Therefore, we invite specialists from the field of Translation Studies and Translation Pedagogy and professional translators interested in the topic to participate in the event. We sincerely hope that the Congress will create an opportunity to examine the current state of affairs in the field, both on a theoretical and practical plane, reflect on the relevant research findings and share inspirations with a view to providing an interface between translator education and the translation profession.



### **Conference topics include, but are not limited to:**

- Evolutions
- New professions
- Transdisciplinarity
- Consolidation of pedagogical approaches
- Relevant areas of MA and PhD research
- Distance learning in translator education
- Challenges posed by digitalisation
- The translator and the translation teacher/trainer/educator in the digital era
- Human-computer interfaces

### **Conference format and types of sessions**

We are hoping to be able to hold the conference in an on-site mode, featuring a number of plenary lectures by renowned scholars, followed by individual paper presentations. Yet, if it turns out not to be COVID-safe, the conference will be held online in its entirety (most probably on Zoom/MS Teams).

**Paper presentations:** The length for presentations will be 30 minutes (20 minutes for presentation plus 10 minutes for discussion).

**The languages of the conference** are English and Polish.
